STATE UNDERGROUND POWER PROGRAM ROUND 6 - TRIGG

We are getting in touch as your property falls within the project area for the State Underground Power Program (SUPP) Round 6.

In August 2016 you (or the previous owner of your property) would have been notified by the Public Utilities Office (PUO) via mail that an area of Trigg was being considered for an underground power project. The notification would also have been accompanied by a letter containing more detailed project information, including a disclosure that property owners would be asked to contribute a portion of the project costs – an estimated \$10,100 per typical single residential property – and a survey to gauge your support for the project.

The results from that survey showed that 63% (the majority) of respondants supported the project and the associated costs, and the SUPP Steering Committee (which is made up of representatives from the PUO, Western Power and the WA Local Government Association) recommended that the Trigg project go ahead. This decision was announced via a Ministerial media release on 27 January 2017.

Given that two years have passed since you (or the property owner) were first surveyed, we wanted to get in touch to remind you about the project and let you know that a more detailed confirmation of your financial contribution will be provided in the coming months (once confirmed by Western Power). While the project still has a number of approvals to go through before it is able to begin, works should commence during the first half of 2020 and take approximately 12 months to complete.
