Targeted investigation methods (such as hand auger sampling and borehole drilling) and best-practice remediation techniques (including in-situ treatment, phytoremediation, engineered capping or targeted excavation) are to be considered where appropriate. All investigation findings and remediation outcomes must be documented and made available to the City to demonstrate that vegetation removal is restricted to areas necessary for remediation. c. Prior to any vegetation removal, the applicant shall identify opportunities to retain mature canopy trees where practicable and apply the environmental mitigation hierarchy, including avoidance and minimisation of impacts. d. The applicant shall consider opportunities to retain mature canopy trees and significant vegetation through the application of international best-practice sustainable urban design principles, including, where practicable, adapting building footprints, infrastructure layout and public open space design to integrate existing trees and ecological features into the redevelopment.
