

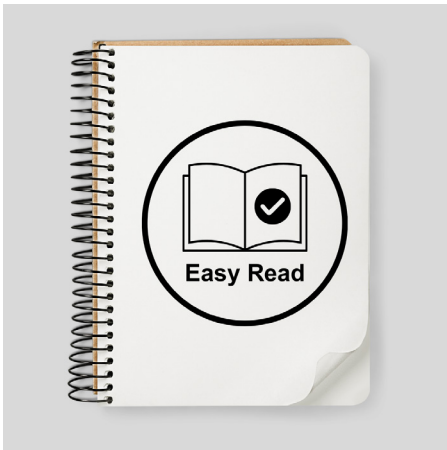

What people told us

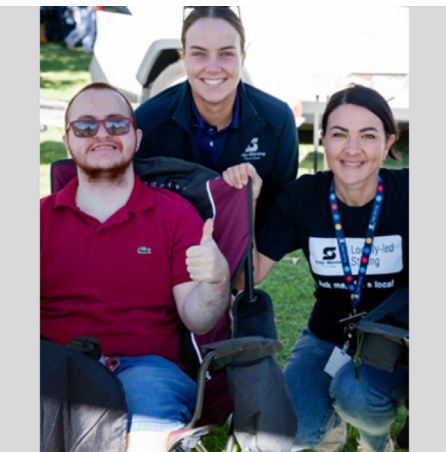


The City asked people what would make life better.

Make activities easier to join.

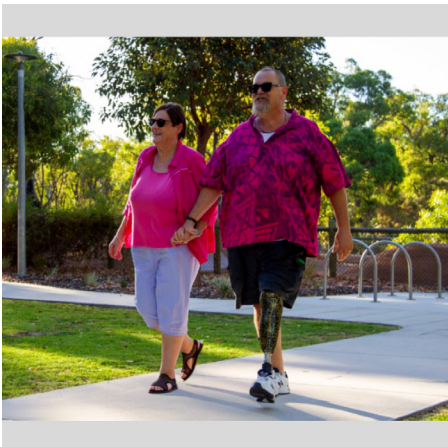


The City will make it easier for people with disability to join:

- Be included.

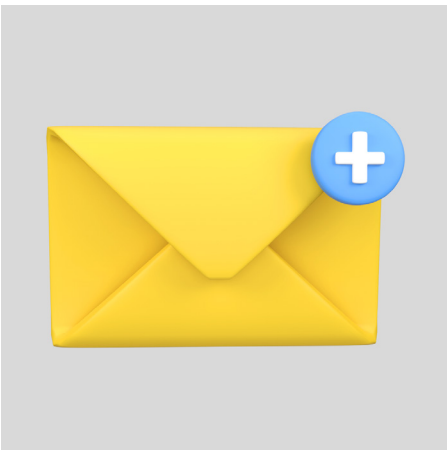

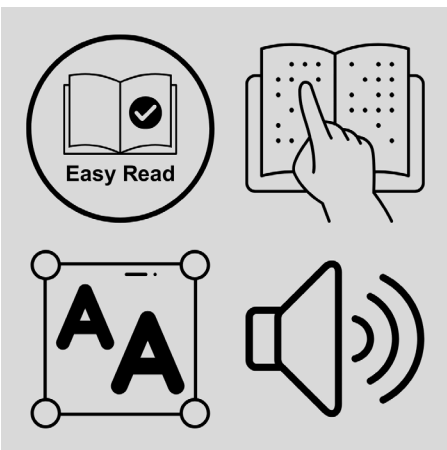
