## Local news

Beaufort Street's new lighting.



**Beaufort Street is shining brighter than ever after a \$200,000 lighting upgrade to the heart of Mount Lawley.** A canopy of 750 colour-changing LED bulbs now spans the width of Beaufort Street near Walcott Street. Visitors can enjoy the display every night with light shows at 7.00pm, 8.00pm and 9.00pm. The upgrade was funded through the Australian Government's Investing in Our Communities Program.

The City welcomed **two new table tennis amenities at Alexander Park, Menora and Yokine Regional Open Space**, with local artist Marisa Santosa transforming the tables with fun and fresh pops of colour. The tables were made possible through an election commitment by the Member for Mount Lawley.



**In August, the City presented donations of \$3,000 each to the General Sir John Monash RSL President Warren Austin and Mt Lawley-Inglewood RSL President Mark Mackin to help with the costs of ANZAC Day 2026 commemorations.**



The City's Community Safety team has been hard at work to improve safety through the **deployment of mobile CCTV trailers in the Lawley Ward.** Areas targeted recently include Hamer Park Reserve in Mount Lawley. These deployments help deter a range of behaviours, including illegal dumping or littering.

## Future Stirling

**A major review of our Strategic Community Plan kicked off with the Future Stirling engagement.**

We held a Business Brew and five community pop-ups in the Lawley Ward, with 233 locals completing a survey. Focus areas to emerge include liveable neighbourhoods, an integrated transport system and a safer City. These insights will shape the next steps of the review, including community workshops and a Future Forum in early 2026.
