## **Osborne Community Hub in Tuart Hill**

has something to offer residents of all ages. In addition to regular library programs, Outdoor Storytime is back at Stirling Libraries – Osborne in 2026, with Robinson Reserve playing host to stories, songs and games for children aged 2-5 years. Local cinephiles can enjoy the free Monthly Movie Matinee in the main hall, while the more adventurous can try their hand at Dungeons and Dragons from 5.00pm – 6.30pm on the first and third Thursdays of the month.

## **Street tree planting is coming soon to Osborne Park, Tuart Hill and Stirling.**

Each year, the City plants around 7,000 new trees across street verges, reserves and natural areas through a range of planting programs. A

key part of this work is our street tree planting program, which helps create cooler, greener and healthier neighbourhoods.



## **The Urban Road Safety Program for Joondanna and Tuart Hill is due to start shortly.**

Developed by the City and Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA) following 139 crashes between 2020 and 2024, the MRWA-funded program will deliver 41 raised safety platforms and 22 asphalt speed cushions. Community feedback showed 69 per cent support for the proposal.



## **A major intersection upgrade is coming at Jon Sanders Drive, Powis Street and Harborne Street in Glendalough.**

Planned in collaboration with MRWA and the Town of Cambridge, works will include additional lanes, red/green pedestrian crossing lights, improved light phasing for efficiency and enhanced safety for both pedestrians and vehicles. The WA Government will fund two thirds of the project, with Stirling and Cambridge to fund the final third. Funding approval is expected in August 2026.

## **Living Locally**

The Living Locally Project encourages everyone to get involved in what it means to live locally through a series of City-hosted events designed to build social connection, highlight local strengths and identify opportunities to improve local liveability. The Living Locally Project team will be hosting events in Tuart Hill and Osborne Park in August and September.
