The Wembley Downs District Fair returned to Laurie Leckie Park for another packed day of entertainment, amusement rides and market stalls. Proudly supported by the City of Stirling's Community Grants Program and presented in partnership with the Wembley Downs Scouts Group, the fair showcases the talents of local schools, youth groups and community organisations.

The City's Community Safety team is dedicated to working with the community to enhance neighbourhood safety. In September, Community Safety hosted a Safety Check at Yuluma Reserve in collaboration with the newly formed Innaloo Community Association Incorporated. Held

check allowed the
Community Safety
Team to engage
with residents to
help identify and
reduce crime and
antisocial behaviour.

The City recently installed a specially designed bird watering station at Millett Park, Innaloo. Developed by the Town of Victoria

Park, the bird waterer provides a safe, clean and consistent water source, helping native bird species such as endangered Black Cockatoos to thrive in urban areas.

Jackadder Lake Reserve, Woodlands hosted the international Water Lantern Festival in November.

Featuring food trucks and family friendly activities, the festival concluded with the launch of personalised lanterns onto the water as the sun set to create a unique visual spectacle.

Future Stirling

A major review of our Strategic Community Plan kicked off with the Future Stirling engagement, with eight pop-ups held in the Doubleview Ward and 270 locals completing a survey.

Focus areas to emerge include enhancing safety across neighbourhoods, ensuring an efficient transport system and liveable neighbourhoods. These insights will shape the next steps of the review, including community workshops and a Future Forum in early 2026.
