Scarborough Beach continues to host major City-sponsored events. JazzConnect sent off winter with three days of live music, while Groundswell Festival featured wall-to-wall action for all ages, followed by the ExPRO Perth Fitness Summit and Festival.

Earlier this year, the City conducted extensive consultation on a proposed coastal boardwalk between Scarborough and Trigg. We received 2,499 submissions during the month-long consultation period, with 70 per cent community support for the proposal. The City will now take time to review the feedback in detail as part of the ongoing feasibility study.

The iconic Scarborough Beach Clock Tower is now lit in a range of colours. The recent installation of feature lighting will contribute to the character and vibrancy

of Scarborough Beach.



Pickleball has arrived at Stirling Leisure – Scarborough. A fun, inclusive and easy-to-learn game, pickleball combines elements of tennis, badminton and table tennis played on a badminton-sized court. Keen to give it a try? Social pickleball sessions are held on Tuesdays from 1.00pm to 3.00pm, no bookings required.

As part of the City's partnership with Constable Care, Scarborough Primary School participated in a safety-focused excursion in September. To celebrate local student Eli's winning entry in the City's Road Safety Slogan competition, "Be your own cross boss", Community Safety Rangers presented a Certificate of Recognition for his contribution to road safety awareness.

Future Stirling

A major review of our Strategic Community Plan kicked off with the Future Stirling engagement. We held a Business Brew and 11 community popups in the Coastal Ward, with 258 locals completing a survey.

Focus areas to emerge include an efficient transport system, liveable neighbourhoods and the environment. These insights will shape the next steps of the review, including community workshops and a Future Forum in early 2026.
