Carine Junior FC players under new floodlights at Aintree Eglinton Reserve.



Aintree Eglinton Reserve in Hamersley received a glow-up with new floodlights installed at the grounds.

The upgrades will allow night training and match play for all codes of community football, partly funded through the WA Government's PlayOn WA initiative. The PlayOn WA initiative aims to deliver 2,030 community infrastructure items across WA by 2030.

The Recycling Centre Balcatta is set for a \$16 million upgrade, making

trips to the facility quicker and safer by separating residential and commercial waste services. Improvements include a major waste transfer station expansion, a new entrance and weighbridges for waste trucks and other commercial vehicles, as well as refurbishments to the existing structure. Construction is expected to start in mid-2026.



The labours of a small local group have blossomed into the new Campion Community Garden,

a space for growing, sharing and learning. Their inaugural open day in October featured a tour of the garden, morning tea and a hands-on wicking bed workshop presented by a City Sustainability Officer.



Paw-some Day Out, the City's biggest pet-friendly event, celebrated its 10th anniversary.

Thousands of dog lovers descended on Rickman Delawney Reserve in Balcatta to enjoy a day of live music, competitions, pet-themed markets and a pop-up vet clinic, while raising awareness around responsible pet ownership.

Future Stirling

A major review of our Strategic Community Plan kicked off with the Future Stirling engagement, with seven pop-ups held in the Hamersley Ward and 206 locals completing a survey.

Focus areas to emerge include safety in the City, having an integrated transport system and current and future community needs. These insights will shape the next steps of the review, including community workshops and a Future Forum in early 2026.
