New parking wayfinding signage

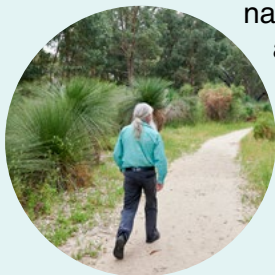
has been installed at Scarborough and Trigg beaches and West Coast Highway to guide drivers to the best entrance points. Live bay availability is now visible on the City's website.

Signage has been installed at Trigg Beach to educate locals and visitors about the **historic use of fish traps by Nyoongar peoples** prior to European settlement, as told to Elder Oriel Green OAM by her grandfather.

Works are underway on a **new permanent interpretive trail through Trigg Bushland Reserve** that will celebrate

native flora and fauna, ancient pathways and changing landscape.

The Trigg Bushland Story Trail is expected to be complete by August 2026.



Our playground renewal program

ensures City playgrounds are fun, safe, compliant with Australian standards and support our Public Open Space Exercise Equipment Policy. Renewals have been completed at Charles Riley Memorial Reserve in North Beach, Trigg Island in Trigg and Stirling Libraries – Karrinyup and Trusley Tone Reserve in Karrinyup.



Upgrades to Henderson Environmental Centre are set to create a more comfortable, modern and welcoming space. New landscaped gardens are almost complete, with building renewals to follow.

A new CoastSnap station at Mettams Pool aims to raise awareness about coastal erosion and encourage visitors to become citizen scientists. By taking a photo of the shoreline and uploading it to the CoastSnap portal, beachgoers can help us monitor coastal erosion. Every photo helps.
