The City held a Safety Check at Stirling Libraries – Dianella.

The City of Stirling's 2026 Community Citizen of the Year is Dianella resident Vicky Young, the president and co-founder of Dandelions WA, a charity which delivers support and dignity to people across the state. As part of their Back to School campaign, Dandelions WA delivered 17,000 backpacks filled with school supplies to vulnerable children.

In February, the City hosted a **Safety Check at Stirling Libraries – Dianella**, providing an opportunity for residents to raise concerns about safety in their neighbourhoods and discuss local support services. Key issues included road and parking safety, clean streets, housing-related anti-social behaviour and communication and engagement.



Our playground renewal program

ensures City playgrounds are fun, safe, compliant with Australian standards and support our Public Open Space Exercise Equipment Policy. Renewals have been completed at Macaulay Park in Inglewood and Croft Reserve in Dianella.



Four local reserves in Dianella have received exciting new additions through our local reserve upgrade program, including Howes Malba Reserve, Seabrook Wrigley Reserve, Wake Pola Reserve and Lennard Jeffery Reserve.

Visiting the library in Inglewood Ward just got safer thanks to a series of **CCTV improvements at Stirling Libraries – Inglewood and Dianella,** including increased camera coverage of the facilities and upgrades to the system to allow remote access for improved efficiency.
