The City launched Auslan Storytime at Stirling Libraries – Osborne in Term 3 and 4 in partnership with Deaf Connect. The fortnightly interactive storytelling sessions have made early literacy more accessible for Deaf and hard of hearing families.

Local families came together recently to plant more than 50 mature trees to transform Shearwater Spoonbill Reserve in Stirling. Guided by Educated by Nature, families crafted delightful clay creatures to accompany their trees while Lions Club of Stirling provided a good feed to our hardworking volunteers.

The City recently hosted its biennial Art Awards and Exhibition at the Civic Centre in Stirling. Visitors enjoyed a selection of 158 original artworks from across WA and a curated program of free talks and tours.

at a community planting event in October.

The upgrades include a new playground co-designed with students from Tuart Hill Primary School, new picnic facilities, park furniture, footpath connections, lighting, bike racks, formalised parking and signage and toilets. The new toilet facilities feature a mural by artist Tessa Dorotich inspired by native flora and her childhood, capturing a sense of childlike play and wonder. The Australian Government contributed \$500,000 to the project, with \$750,000 coming from the City.

Future Stirling

A major review of our Strategic Community Plan kicked off with the Future Stirling engagement.

We held a Business Brew and 10 community pop-ups in the Osborne Ward, with 122 locals completing a survey. Focus areas to emerge include environmental concerns, liveable neighbourhoods and a safer City. These insights will shape the next steps of the review, including community workshops and a Future Forum in early 2026.
