

## Verge treatment application form

Property address adjacent to the proposed verge treatment

It is a legal requirement that permission is sought before any private works are undertaken on a public thoroughfare or local government land. However, the City permits the planting or installation of lawn, plants and/or organic mulch on the verge without prior approval.

Materials which require prior approval are hardstand materials including paving, synthetic turf and in-situ concrete.

- I agree that the work will be done in accordance with the City's Verge Treatment Guidelines and Specifications, and acknowledge that;
- The maximum area allowed for paving, concrete or synthetic turf is one-third (1/3) of the verge excluding the crossover and the footpath;
- Permissible paving material is brick and concrete unit pavers and paver size must be stated on diagram;
- Clear delineation of the crossover from the paving and concrete to be provided;
- The level and grade of the verge is not to be altered;
- The landscape treatment needs to allow for a street tree, if one is not present;



- Please refer to the City's Street and Reserve Tree Policy for setback requirements of verge treatments from street trees.
- No plants higher than 750 mm when mature, or of hazardous nature are allowed;
- No retaining walls, steps or any other items protruding above the natural level of the verge are allowed:
- No inorganic mulches (stone, pebbles, gravel) are allowed;
- Landscape treatments in the Heritage Protection areas (Mt Lawley, Menora and Inglewood) require a separate Planning Approval;
- A 2 m wide access for pedestrians must be provided along the road kerb line, where there is no footpath;
- All verge treatments must be non-slip.

You must provide the City with a plan of the proposed verge treatment which includes the dimensions of the proposed area to be landscaped (space is available below for this purpose or a separate plan can be submitted).
