Texture pack

A selection of plants with interesting textures and shapes plus bright colours, they are hardy, attract a variety of wildlife and once established, have very low water requirements.



Species

- **1. Darwinia "Seaspray"** (*Darwinia citriodora -* prostrate form) H 30cm, W 90cm An attractive small groundcover or container plant, it has lemon-scented silvery-green foliage and unusual orange & red flowers from winter through to summer. Attracts honeyeaters, butterflies and native bees.
- 2. Snakebush (Hemiandra pungens) H 50cm, W 200cm Groundcover with prickly foliage and purple flowers in summer. Tolerates full sun or partial shade. Prefers well-drained light to heavy soils.
- 3. Nobby Clubrush (Ficinia nodosa) H 100cm, W 80cm
 A fast growing native tussock grass with globular seed heads from mid-spring to early summer.
- **4. Grey Cottonheads** (*Conostylis candicans*) H 50cm, W 50cm Prefers a full sun to part shade position in well-drained soil including coastal. Flowers from autumn through to spring. Attracts nectar eating birds.
- **5. Cushion Bush** (*Leucophyta brownii*) H 70cm, W 100cm Small rounded shrub with silvery-white foliage and small yellow flowers from late spring to summer.
